Safe Passage for Children 2019 Legislative Priorities

Current Situation:

- Approximately 15,000 more children getting child protection help since Governor's Child Protection Task Force in 2015
- Caseloads increased in all parts of the system
- At 26%, state support for child protection & foster care still 2nd lowest nationally

Please support these proposals to strengthen child protection and foster care

1. Infrastructure

- Child Welfare Training Academy HF 499/SF 958 (Kresha/Mathews)
 - Basic resource for a quality child protection/foster care program
 - In Governor's budget
 - \$4.16 million in FY 2020 -21 and \$5.76 million in FY 2022 23
- Support Guardians ad litem and Public Defenders in Governors Budget
 - \$10.9 million so all eligible children get a guardian
 - Public Defenders \$10 million in FY 2020 and \$21 million in FY 2021
 - Bills expected soon in House and Senate
- Please vote for racial disparities study by Office of Legislative auditor

2. Prevention

Great Start for Minnesota Children – HF 1/SF 820 (Pinto/Wiklund): funds two evidence-based programs that <u>reduce maltreatment 25% – 50%</u>

- Targeted Home Visiting
 - \$23 million in 2020, \$41 million in 2021
 - Serves 2800+ more families
- Early Learning Scholarships to all eligible children no cost numbers yet

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
